This will refer to Mr. Corbett's letter of June 1st past, in which he, on behalf of Petro-Canada, registered a complaint about information furnished by Paramount Energy Operating Corp. ("PEOC"). As we understand it, the facts are as follows:

1. Upon receipt of Petro-Canada's IR, PEOC offered to supply the model data digitally in a format that suited Petro-Canada. On May 3rd, Petro-Canada advised that it did not have the capability to use the digital data of geostatistical model.
2. PEOC then received a revised IR from Petro-Canada; on May 11th, PEOC supplied Petro-Canada with the requested information.
3. Petro-Canada subsequently contacted PEOC with an additional request, essentially requiring a re-doing of the information previously supplied. This would require a duplication of effort, on the part of PEOC. Had this request been made earlier, the graphs requested could have been made available.
4. PEOC explained to Ms. Koller that PEOC's consultant was not available until June 5th. PEOC's own internal efforts to provide the newly requested information could not address the issue.


In fact, PEOC has supplied the data requested. PEOC categorically rejects any suggestion that it has been either misleading or unresponsive. PEOC will continue to attempt to assist Petro-Canada, but there must be some reason to the process.
